**Reflections from Fr. Martin
The Epiphany
January 7th, 2024**



The 2nd Reading contains a statement that is at once most challenging yet most hope-filled: to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy—in this time as we continue to celebrate Christ's birth and the salvation he offers in the heavenly banquet!

We need constant reminders of this because outside of the church walls we're bombarded with the line/lie that, "this life is it, so you might as well just live for yourself." I hope you've realized by now (and if you haven't I hope you don't learn the hard way) that living for this world alone will sooner or later lead to big disappointment.

Instead, Paul hoping we insure that our actions reflect our conviction of our destiny, and that our Lord and God who has already given us everything out of infinite love for us. Our actions best reflect this when they are striving to love others the same way as much as possible—by both giving, forgiving, and not giving-in to the pressures in the world when we're feeling rejected, alone, mistreated, or unappreciated.

Yet Paul also reminds us that we are meant to be sustained in our perseverance by our hope in the promise contained in revelation. We are only here for so long and then we have the invitation to forever be free of all pain and filled with a joy infinitely greater than we can ever imagine! If we can remember this "big-picture" we can remember our true citizenship...so no one can ever convince us that we belong anywhere else!

Therefore, men should always wear at least a collared shirt as well as slacks, and women should always wear either dresses or appropriate slacks and blouses. This is not so-much because of modesty (important as that is), but because of respect. The consensus of Biblical scholars agree that the reason Saint Peter put on his outer garments in John 21:7 was to show respect, as he knew he was approaching God. Thank you for your consideration.

For those requiring low-gluten hosts for weekend Mass, please approach the main priest/celebrant at Communion time & say "gluten free".

If you wish to set an appointment with Fr. Martin, please request so through the receptionist/operator. Please Do not dial-into Fr. Martin's voicemail as prompted by the phone system.
